One of our primary roles each year is to promote, build and host a dynamic campus conference. The role of this conference has proven to be significant. A great deal of training takes place during these four days. Perhaps even more importantly the conference has given our students the forum to meet, connect and discuss the Kingdom at large. Our campus ministers have formed important partnerships and forged relationships during these times as well. Finally, it is a great opportunity to identify future leadership and connect them with mentoring and opportunity.

Our campus conferences are momentum-building, spirit-filled events! Nearly 3000 participated in last year's U.S. conferences. We are estimating that 3500 will attend this year in St Louis during the July 4th weekend.

More than 15 campus conferences took place 2013 all around the globe with nearly 5000 in attendance! This year's ICMC in St. Louis will be entitled "Unshakable." Registration for that event will be online by the end of the month.

Subcommittees

We presently have one functioning sub-committee on the service team. They are tasked with oversight and planning of the One Year Challenge. Both Glenn Petruzzi and Chris Clawson work on the OYC sub-committee. Since 2011 an estimated 500-600 students have participated in the OYC all over the world.

When the Middle East Campus Conference took place in Beirut with 60 in attendance from Egypt, Lebanon, and Jordan and the US. LA church sent five students to Beirut for the OYC and they had three baptisms in Beirut only weeks after the team arrived. In faith all the students stayed in country even through political unrest.

The overall impact of the OYC is difficult to quantify and now more than ever with our 2020 Vision mission plantings and beyond the need for harvest workers is greater than ever before. We believe the OYC can provide the necessary energy and hands to be a part of seeing the 2020 Visions become a reality. In 2013 the campus committee, in cooperation with the singles and mission service committees, have strived to make seven basic criteria that every OYC site is required to meet. This assures that every OYC site can be a great place of spiritual growth and quality missionary experience.

We have taken all existing sites and helped them meet these seven criteria, and we have added 10 international sites and 10 domestic sites with many more to come! Kelcy Hahn has helped to organize this mighty effort by managing the Disciples Adventures site on Disciples Today. We are grateful to Roger Lamb and Disciples Today for helping organize the OYC efforts through this portal. Chris Clawson has helped coordinate the efforts on the west coast of America and foreign OYC sites. He has provided great leadership and service to taking the OYC higher. 2013 was a great year of organizing this effort and multiplying the efforts. The potential of the OYC has greatly opened up, as any church or mission team can be a OYC site. This allows any church or any mission planting that meets the seven criteria to have an OYC site and does limit the OYC site to a handful of sites. Below are the seven criteria:

3. Must be lead by a full-time evangelist or be disciplined/overseen by an evangelist
4. Must submit site proposal/promotion and training plan in writing send in PDF form to: Kelcy Hahn: kelcyhahn@yahoo.com

5. Must submit a promotional video (2-3 Minutes) that will be played during the conference and on your personal OYC website page
6. Must contribute \$100 yearly to Disciples Adventures/OYC Site through Disciples Today. Contact Kelcy Hahn: kelcyhahn@yahoo.com for instructions on this.
7. Must be approved by the ICOC Campus Committee: In cooperation with the ICOC delegates and committees we want to support all OYC sites in their approval process. We desire to see the OYC sites be quality sites and send as many volunteers to each site as possible. By adhering to this criteria we believe your site will be blessed with many qualified workers.

Here are some of our 5 Suggested Goals for 2014 with the OYC

1. Have a great OYC mixer at ICMC 2014 in St. Louis, where sites and volunteers can meet and greet one another with hopes that they can take the OYC somewhere. We hope to place at least 100 people in sites from that OYC mixer alone.
2. OYC training for OYC site via conference call; one before conference and one after.
3. Add at least 10 international sites and 10 domestic sites added in 2014, we already have 5 international and 5 domestic site applicants.
4. As the campus committee is striving to help foreign campus ministry grow and flourish we can use the OYC to help infuse their campus ministry sites.
5. Strive to collect the stories or chronicle previous OYC volunteers' experiences and either make a video or write an article to inspire more to go on the OYC.

Conclusion

We believe that the momentum of the campus ministries in the last seven to eight years is pushing our focus abroad. We are planning for 2014 to be a year when our connection and understanding of campus ministry outside the U.S. deepens. If the campus ministry can help to make greater headway into spreading the gospel and training future leaders on other international soils the same way it has done in the U.S., we are servants toward that end.

In the U.S. our task is to continue to train and prepare the great harvest God continues to bring in as our ministries bear fruit in increasing measure. Our sincerest hope is that our churches feel the relief and inspiration of young, capable, spiritual and willing servants entering their ministries after they graduate from college.
